Provide clear information about home-work tasks.

Run information sessions on supporting children's learning at home.

Read and act upon correspondence sent from home.

Provide information to parents through regular newsletters, emails, letters, texts, school website and meetings.

Make available all relevant school policies, for information.



As a school, we will...

Care for each child's safety and well-being, and maintain high standards of behaviour.

Set homework to extend and support learning as appropriate.

Be open, approachable and welcoming.

Provide opportunities for parents to become involved in school life.

Communicate effectively with parents in a variety of ways (see overleaf **Home-School Communication**).

As a parent, I will...

Ensure my child arrives at school on time, properly equipped for the day.

Ensure my child is collected promptly at the end of the school day.

Ensure my child is dressed in line with the Uniform & Jewellery Policy.

Support my child with homework and ensure homework is returned on time.

Attend parent/teacher consultations and other meetings about my child's progress and well-being.

Support and work with the school in any behaviour management issues in accordance with the Behaviour Policy.

Let the school know of any concerns which may affect my child's work or behaviour at school.

Foster a positive attitude towards the school and arrange to discuss any concerns with a member of staff.

Be polite and respectful to all adults and children on school premises.

Read and act upon correspondence sent from school.

Work in partnership with the school to develop positive attitudes towards those from different cultures and races and with different values and beliefs.

As a pupil, I will...
