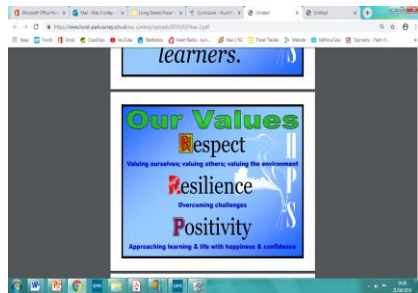

- KS1 is Years 1 and 2 and KS2 is Years 3-6.
- Children in KS1 and KS2 follow the National Curriculum rather than the EYFS curriculum.

Drop Off and Pick Up

o 8:55 start

- o The children line up on the blue spots.
- o Please say goodbye to children at your spot.
- o When the teacher collects their class you can tell them if your child is being collected by someone different.

o 3:15 finish

- o Children to be collected from the left hand stairs next to the allotment.
- o Please wait for your child in the playground.
- o Your child will be sent to you once the teacher has seen you.

Lessons

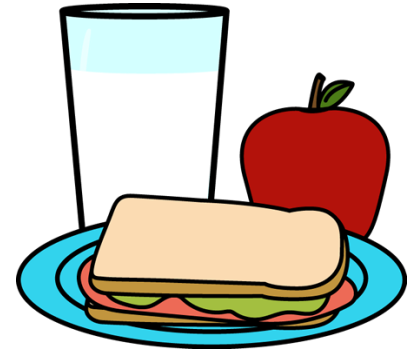
- We will slowly transition the children from free flow learning to formal learning.
- For the first few weeks, they will remain in their coloured groups from Reception.
- They will be welcomed into the classroom with an activity on their tables.
- Both year 1 classes have similar timetables and do some activities together.
- We still allow time for child initiated activities.
- Both classrooms are set up with provision areas.
- We value inside and outside learning.

Break Times



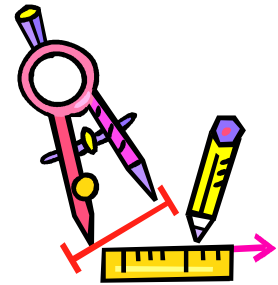
- Morning break – **20 minutes**
- Afternoon break – **15 minutes**
- Free fruit is provided
- They already have lunch play and some of their afternoon playtimes with the rest of the school in the big playground.
- Milk – you can still pay for your child to have milk if you wish.

Lunch Time



- Lunch is 15 minutes later than reception.
- It follows the same structure.
 - **The children will wash their hands.**
 - **They will line up in the corridor ready to walk through to the hall with an adult.**
 - **They need to sit in their space.**
 - **Their food will be served by an adult.**
 - **The children put their hand up once they have finished.**
- All children are still entitled to free school meals.
- You can decide per half term whether your child is having school dinners or packed lunch.

Equipment



- The children are provided with stationery and equipment.
- Water bottles should be named and in everyday.
- Please ensure that bags, uniform, glasses and PE kits are named.
- The PE kit is to come in on Monday and taken home on Friday. They will independently change at school.
- The children should be encouraged to take responsibility for these items.

PE Kit

- White t – shirt
- Green shorts
- Green jogging bottoms
- Green jumper
- Trainers
- Spare socks
- Spare underwear



- They will no longer need a Forest School kit as we will visit as and when it relates to our topic.

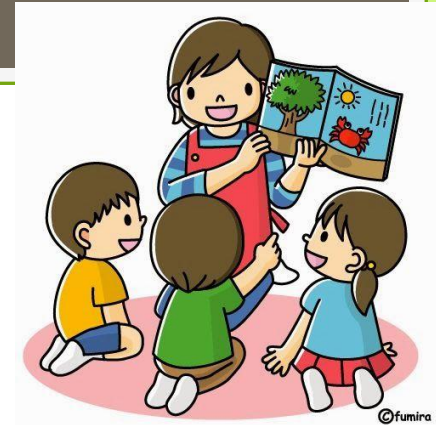
Reading

 - June



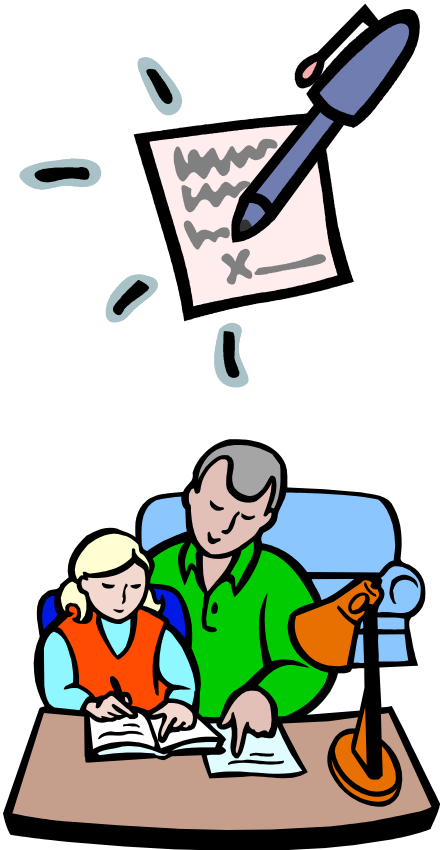
Transition
